

# Members' PRINT Competition 2025-2026

## **RULES**

- 1. Rounds: There are **3 rounds**, members may submit **2 prints per round**. Members may enter either of 2 categories Open or Beginners/Intermediate whichever is appropriate to their experience. (See note 1). Members need not enter every round.
- 2. Scoring: Judges will score all prints out of 20.
- 3. Winner: The member accumulating the most points from all their entered prints will win the competition.
- 4. Subject: Subject matter is entirely open in all rounds.
- 5. Own Work: all photographs must have been captured and edited by the member, including all parts of a composite image. (See note 2.) But commercially printed and mounted prints are allowed.
- 6. Size and Label: prints may be any size but must be mounted. Mounts may not exceed 50 cm x 40 cm. Mounts must be labelled on the back with the member's name, print title and category (i.e. beginner or open).
- 7. Print Eligibility: Prints can only be entered once, including substantially similar prints and mono conversions. However, the Members' Competitions (prints and PDIs) are separate from all other Society competitions and exhibitions. Any print (or PDI version of a print) may be used in other competitions or exhibitions and vice versa (except the Members' PDI Competition).
- 8. Submitting Entries: Prints should be submitted at the previous 'in person' meeting before the competition evening together with a completed entry form and a PDI file for projection email to to <a href="mailto:richard13hall@gmail.com">richard13hall@gmail.com</a>. (See note 3.)
- 9. All digital images and prints may be selected to represent the club in interclub competitions. If you do not want your photographs used this way, please inform the Competition Secretary.

#### Note 1: Beginners/Intermediate

This category is intended for less experienced photographers and any who are new to club competitions. Those with recognised photographic qualifications (e.g. LRPS, CPAGB) should not enter. Neither should those who have been successful winning both the

members' competition Beginners/Intermediate category and the Annual Exhibition Beginners' section. If in doubt speak with the Competition Secretary.

Should there be only one or two members entering the Beginners/Intermediate section, their prints may be included within the 'open' section for judging, but scores will be kept separately.

### Note 2: Images to be author's own work.

A member must be the creator of all photographic elements within an image – "they must have taken the photograph(s)". In composite images, all component parts must meet this requirement. Computer manipulations are allowed but must be made by the author. Techniques such as selection, noise reduction, "burning & dodging", textures, montage, HDR, focus stacking, stitching, warping and distortion, cloning, healing, removal of distractions and other similar techniques are allowed.

Elements from photographs not created by the author are not allowed e.g. imported or Al generated skies, unless the sky comes from the photographer's own photograph.

Use of image generator systems to create new images via a prompt or specification (Al created images) are not allowed.

#### Note 3: Digital Files

Images must be a maximum of 1600 pixels horizontally by 1200 pixels vertically and saved as jpg, maximum quality. Do not fill spare pixels within that format.

Name your files with the number 1 or 2 followed by a space, followed by the exact title of your image. For example: 1 misty morning.jpg and 2 tranquil sunset.jpg.
