It is an excellent way of meeting other members of the society as well as understanding our history and the current issues that we face. During the coming year the council will be considering the nature and size of its membership to enable the effective and efficient running of its affairs. We will report back to the membership at the next AGM.

I would like to thank the many volunteers who have helped with setting up the exhibitions, stewarding, setting out the hall for meetings. Finally, thanks must go to those who heeded the call to be tea and coffee monitors and actually filled out the tea rota.

I would like to thank you the members for staying with us this year. We know that some societies have folded. Although our numbers are down on the peak that we had pre COVID we still have a respectable membership and have actually attracted some new members. I hope those new members have enjoyed their experience and will stay with us in the coming years.
